Statewide VP Plan: ICJIA's role



The Authority shall develop, publish, and facilitate the implementation of a four-year statewide violence prevention plan, which shall incorporate public health, public safety, victim services, and trauma recovery centers and services.



Statewide VP Plan: Collaborative Approach



- In partnership with the University of Illinois, ICJIA's VP researchers lead the project in a collaboration with 13 state agencies and other stakeholders.
- Planners viewed multiple presentations and participated in meetings and working groups
- Researchers conducted comprehensive needs assessment, research, and data analysis on all 102 Illinois counties.



Statewide VP Plan: Insights & Findings



- Disproportionate rates of violent victimization and exposure to violence by race, ethnicity, sex, gender, and sexual identity, and in geography (e.g., rural vs. urban; City of Chicago).
- Violence prevention service providers were engaged in addressing community risk factors, but faced barriers, such as funding, capacity, and other resources.
- Illinois adults reported high levels of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACES), calling for trauma-informed and healing services.



Statewide VP Plan: Our Five VP Goals



- Stop Violence & Promote Safety
- Support Children, Youth, and Families by Emphasizing Programs that Foster Social Connectedness and Belonging
- Advance Equity
- Promote Health
- Promote Collaboration across State, Municipal, and Community-Based Agencies



Statewide VP Plan: Implementation



- Communication & Alignment via ICJIA Violence Prevention Ad Hoc Committee (Quarterly meetings)
- Release equity-focused Notice of Funding Opportunity Model
 - Support via transparent processes, outreach, and technical assistance

Ongoing data collection & data analyses to influence process improvement
